ABC++ Code Writing	June 24-29	Computer lovers will jump into this crash course for code writing and programming in different languages such as Python, JAVA, and C++.
ACT Prep: Basic Review	June 10-15 and July 15-19	College admissions and scholarship acquisition are becoming more competitive. Good ACT scores give students an edge on the competition. This course will prepare students for both the math and English sections of the exam.
ACT Prep: Mathematics	June 17-22	Students will review questions and gain valuable test-taking strategies to help improve their scores on the Math section of the ACT.
ACT Prep: English	June 24-29	This course will help students focus on the reading, writing, and vocabulary sections of the ACT as well as valuable test-taking strategies.

Behind the Mask	June 24-29	Explore the art and storytelling of comic books through the decades.
College 101	July 8-13	Learn college admissions and ACT prep tips while exploring majors and career options. Tour campus, sit in on college classes, talk with financial aid advisors and more.
Creative Writing: Poetry	June 3-8	Read dynamic work by contemporary poets, write and revise your own poems in a safe and encouraging environment, and hone your voice in an effort to improve as a poet and increase confidence in your writing.
Creative Writing: Prose	June 10-15	Find out what it means to write imaginatively. Learn to write prose, short stories, travel blogs, plays, and everything in-between.
CSI Summer Camp <i>(Rising 10th-12th graders)</i>	July 15-20	Students who love puzzles, science museums, and watching forensic science television shows can enjoy a hands-on experience from the world of a forensic scientist.

Imaginative Realism in Art	June 3-8	Travel campus and Oxford to create works of art based on the world around you and enjoy visiting many galleries around town.
Introduction to Engineering	June 10-15	Learn about the various engineering fields with various projects and hands-on experiences.
McLean Entrepreneurial Leadership Program	July 8-13	Designed to foster dialogue about how Mississippi can utilize resources through the University of Mississippi to address some of the state's most pressing needs. MS residents only.
Orchestra String Workshop <i>(Rising 7th-12th graders)</i>	June 3-8	Beginner, Intermediate, and Advanced students are invited to work with UM music professors to improve their individual and group string playing in a relaxed and creative environment.
Rebel Chefs	July 8-13	Students will be immersed in cooking, baking, and learning about local produce and nutrition, and enjoy visits to local community gardens and markets.
Shakespeare at the Movies	June 10-15	Experience Macbeth and the Taming of the Shrew throughout a week of discussions and film critique.
Writing for College Success	July 15-20	Work with UM faculty to improve your college application portfolio, including writing effective scholarship application essays and personal essays.
Writing for Change	June 3-8	This program provides writers with the opportunity to use writing as a way to raise awareness and create action in their lives.
