June 3 – 7	Creative Writing	Be inspired by the same landscapes that nurtured the talents of William Faulkner, John Grisham, and many other writers while you practice a variety of approaches to prose and poetry.
June 3 – 7	Rebel Camp: Intro to Pharmacy Careers	Learn about the diverse careers available within the field of Pharmacy, gain hands-on practice in the compounding lab, and solve a “pharmacy mystery” applying mathematical skills
June 10 – 14	Anime and Manga Drawing	Practice drawing in the style of Japanese Anime and Manga. Focus on figure drawing and creating a believable scene using traditional drawing techniques
