**Application and Admission:** Applicants are encouraged to apply for admission online at [www.olemiss.edu/tupelo](http://www.olemiss.edu/tupelo). If you prefer a paper application, a printable form is available on the website or at the UM-Tupelo office. Mississippi residents must pay a non-refundable \$40 application fee. The non-resident application fee is \$60.

Applicants for admission (undergraduate or graduate) are advised to submit the application for admission well in advance of the period in which enrollment is sought. Mail official transcripts from all prior colleges to the admissions office in Oxford. Applicants applying for the spring can find application deadlines on the academic calendar at [www.olemiss.edu/depts/registrar/acal.html](http://www.olemiss.edu/depts/registrar/acal.html). Late application may require the applicant to register after classes begin and pay associated late registration fees. (See *academic calendar* for details.)

All regional students **MUST** be admitted to The University of Mississippi **before** they will be allowed to register for courses.

**Immunization Requirement:** All applicants born after January 1, 1957, must submit proof of two immunizations for measles and one for rubella prior to registration. 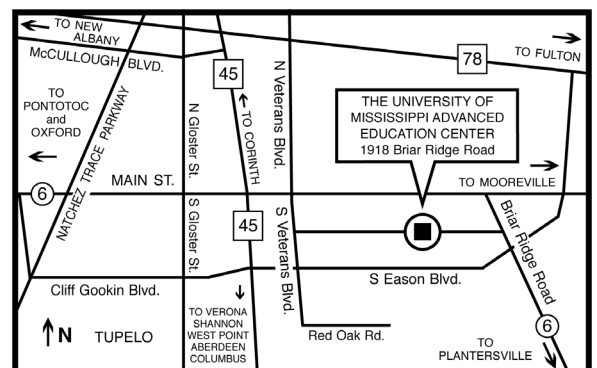
## 2017 Spring Academic Calendars

Classes meet one night a week (Monday-Thursday) from 6-8:30 pm unless stated otherwise.

<b>October 17-31:</b>	Academic Advising
<b>Oct. 24-Nov. 7:</b>	Priority Registration
<b>Oct. 24-Nov. 30:</b>	Phase 1 Registration period
<b>November 11:</b>	Application for first-time enrollment should be submitted no later than this date
<b>December 1:</b>	\$50 registration fee assessed this date. Phase 2 registration.
<b>January 16:</b>	Martin Luther King, Jr. Holiday
<b>January 22:</b>	Last day to officially cancel registration and avoid responsibility for payment of tuition and fees.
<b>January 23:</b>	Classes begin; registration fee (\$100) assessed this date; 100% refund (less 5% of fees or \$100, whichever is less) on withdrawals through February 3. Phase 3 registration.
<b>January 27:</b>	Students may add courses on a space available basis through this date.
<b>February 3:</b>	Last day to register or add courses (between January 28 and February 3 may add only with instructor's approval.) Refund period ends.
<b>February 4:</b>	\$10 fee assessed per drop or add
<b>February 14:</b>	Mandatory drop date for non-attendance.
<b>March 3:</b>	Deadline for course withdrawals (no refund); refund period ended February 3.
