***Coursework to fulfill this requirement is available at UM-Tupelo. Social Work majors may apply no more than 62 community college credit hours to this degree, and general electives help maintain full-time status as a current student. For those reasons, it is strongly suggested that students complete this requirement with UM-Tupelo, ensuring that community college transfer credit does not exceed 62 hours and full-time status may be maintained.**

APPLIED SCIENCES ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION

In addition to the course requirements listed above, the following requirements for graduation apply to all Applied Sciences 2010-2011 degree programs:

- Minimum of 124 credit hours needed for degree (developmental studies courses and repeated courses do not count toward the total number of credit hours)
- At least one-third of the credit hours required for degree must be taken at the 300 level or above (42 hours)
- Minimum GPA of 2.0 in cumulative residence course work (UM courses only) as well as in overall cumulative GPA (includes transfer work)
- No more than half of the credit hours for degree can be from a junior or community college (62 hours)
- At least 25% of course work must be taken from The University of Mississippi (31 hours)

Additional requirements pertaining to certain Applied Sciences degree programs:

- For those degree programs requiring a minor (Criminal Justice, Paralegal Studies, and Communicative Disorders):** Minimum GPA of 2.0 required for minor both in residence course work as well as for overall minor ***GPA (unless specified otherwise for a particular minor—see catalog requirements for your particular minor)***. In addition, at least 6 hours of minor must be taken in residence (from UM).
- Additional GPA requirements for professional course work:**

Social Work	Minimum grade of “C” in each required SW course
Communicative Disorders	Minimum UM and overall GPA in required CD course work
Criminal Justice	Minimum GPA of 2.5 in CJ course work
Exercise Science	Minimum GPA of 2.5 in ES core
Park & Recreation Management	Minimum GPA of 2.5 in PRM core
