IMPORTANT NOTE:

EACH Bachelor of Multi-Disciplinary Studies DEGREE MUST INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING:

1. Satisfy all the requirements for each of three minors as defined by the departments offering those minors with grades of "C" or better (some minors may accept C-, but see advisor for details).
2. At least 30 hours of courses at the 300-level or above
3. At least 30 hours of courses taken at UM (UM Oxford, Booneville, Desoto, Grenada, Tupelo)
4. At least 120 hours total with each course satisfying only one degree requirement (core or minor or elective), with a cumulative resident and overall GPA of at least 2.0.
5. At least 12 of last 21 hours must be taken from UM
