## ENROLLMENT INFORMATION

**Application and Admission:** Applicants are encouraged to apply for admission online at [www.olemiss.edu/desoto](http://www.olemiss.edu/desoto). If you prefer a paper application, a printable form is available on the website or at the UM-DeSoto Center office. Mississippi residents must pay a non-refundable \$40 application fee. The non-resident application fee is \$60.

Applicants for admission (undergraduate or graduate) are advised to submit the application for admission well in advance of the period in which enrollment is sought. Mail official transcripts from all prior colleges to the admissions office in Oxford. Applicants applying for the fall can find application deadlines on the academic calendar at [www.olemiss.edu/depts/registrar/acal.html](http://www.olemiss.edu/depts/registrar/acal.html). Late application may require the applicant to register after classes begin and pay associated late registration fees. (See academic calendar for details.)

All regional students **MUST** be admitted to the University of Mississippi before they will be allowed to register for courses.

**Immunization Requirement:** All applicants born after January 1, 1957, must submit proof of two immunizations for measles and one for rubella prior to registration.
