Transfer students may be admitted under one of the following conditions:

Earn an associate's degree intended for transfer to a four-year school from an accredited community college with a minimum 2.0 cumulative grade-point average (GPA) as calculated by the University of Mississippi.

Meet resident freshman admissions requirements and have at least a 2.0 cumulative GPA as calculated by the University of Mississippi on transferrable credit from a regionally accredited college or university.

Have a 2.0 cumulative GPA as calculated by the University of Mississippi on all transferrable credit AND have successfully completed the following 30 semester hours with a 2.0 GPA at a regionally accredited school:

- 6 semester hours of English Composition
- 3 semester hours of College Algebra, Quantitative Reasoning or a higher level math
- 6 semester hours of Laboratory Science
- 9 semester hours of Humanities and Fine Arts
- 6 semester hours of Social or Behavioral Sciences

UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMS

You may participate in intensive Intercession courses, which meet five nights a week for two weeks. These include: Wintersession during the beginning of January, between the fall and spring semesters; May Intercession in the final weeks of May, between the spring and summer semesters; and August Intercession offered in the first weeks of August, between the summer and fall semesters.

Students also have the option of enrolling in Summer School courses that are offered in various semester terms including First (June), Second (July) and Full Summer (June and July).

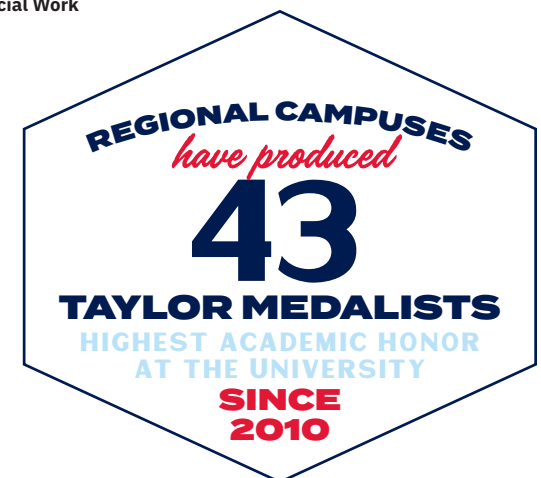

CHECKLIST FOR ADMISSION

APPLY FOR ADMISSION

Submit an online application at olemiss.edu/applynow.

Applications will be processed once all materials and the fee have been received. A \$40 application fee for Mississippi residents or \$60 application fee for nonresidents is required.

SUBMIT TRANSCRIPTS

from each college you have previously attended. Request that they send an official (sealed or emailed E-script) copy of your transcript directly to: University of Mississippi Undergraduate Admissions, P.O. Box 1848, University, MS 38677.

SUBMIT IMMUNIZATION DOCUMENTATION.

All applicants born after January 1, 1957, must submit proof of two immunizations for measles and one for rubella prior to registration. Medical history and certificate of compliance forms are available at healthcenter.olemiss.edu. Submit these documents to your regional campus or the Oxford campus address shown on the form. If you have questions about immunization requirements, contact Student Health Services at (662) 915-7274.

APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID AND SCHOLARSHIPS.

Financial aid representatives are available on each campus. The regional scholarship application priority deadlines are June 30 for fall admission and January 1 for spring admission. Submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at fafsa.gov in order to be considered for all federal and need-based institutional financial aid. The university's financial aid school code is 002440.

MEET WITH AN ACADEMIC ADVISOR.

Academic advising is available on the regional campuses and is required before registering for courses each semester. Schedule an appointment after you receive your admission acceptance letter.

STAY UPDATED.

Check your Ole Miss e-mail and regional campus website regularly for important information such as course schedules, registration dates, textbook information, etc. Follow your campus on Facebook or Twitter.

ATTEND ORIENTATION.

Orientation is required for all transfer students. Get all of the important information you need as a student on an Ole Miss regional campus, and have your student ID made. You will receive orientation information prior to your declared term of enrollment.

SCHOLARSHIPS

To qualify for scholarships, students must be transferring directly from a community college and plan to enroll full time (unless otherwise indicated). The transfer GPA, as calculated by the University of Mississippi, will include grades from all prior colleges attended.

DOES NOT REQUIRE AN APPLICATION:

Community College Academic Excellence 1 Scholarship

- Award Amount: \$6,000 (\$3,000 per year for two years)
- Eligibility: Awarded to community college transfer students with a 3.00–3.49 overall transfer GPA and 48 transferrable community college credit hours. Students must be enrolled full time to receive this award. This award cannot be stacked with Phi Theta Kappa scholarships.

Community College Academic Excellence 2 Scholarship

- Award Amount: \$8,000 (\$4,000 per year for two years)
- Eligibility: Awarded to community college transfer students with a 3.5 or higher overall transfer GPA and 48 transferrable community college credit hours. Students must be enrolled full time to receive this award. Nonresidents will receive an additional \$3,000 per year for two years toward the nonresident fee. This award cannot be stacked with Phi Theta Kappa scholarships.

Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship 1

- Award Amount: \$14,000 (\$7,000 per year for two years)
- Eligibility: Transfer students with a GPA between 3.25 and 3.49 on at least 48 transferable community college credit hours and membership in Phi Theta Kappa. Members of the All Mississippi Team will receive an additional one-time only \$1,000 scholarship and an additional \$1,000 one-time only scholarship will be awarded to those students who become members of the All American Team. Nonresidents will receive an additional \$7,000 per year for two years toward the nonresident fee.

Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship 2

- Award Amount: \$16,000 (\$8,000 per year for two years)
- Eligibility: Transfer students with a GPA of 3.5 or higher on at least 48 transferable community college credit hours and membership in Phi Theta Kappa. Members of the All Mississippi Team will receive an additional one-time only \$1,000 scholarship and an additional \$1,000 one-time only scholarship will be awarded to those students who become members of the All American Team. Nonresidents will receive an additional \$7,000 per year for two years toward the nonresident fee.

Phi Theta Kappa President Scholarship

- Award Amount: \$2,000 (\$1,000 per year for two years)
- Eligibility: Community college transfer students who served as President of Phi Theta Kappa. These scholarships are awarded to community college transfer students with an overall GPA of 3.25 or higher and 48 transferrable community college credit hours. Students must be enrolled full time to receive this award.

Community College Student Body President

- Award Amount: \$3,000 (\$1,500 per year for two years)
- Eligibility: Community college transfer students who served in the top elected position at their community college. These scholarships are awarded to community college transfer students with 48 transferrable community college credit hours. Students must be enrolled full time to receive this award.

New Century Scholarship

- Award Amount: Full resident tuition for two years (fall and spring semesters). Nonresident students will receive an additional scholarship to cover their full nonresident fee for two years (fall and spring semesters).
- Eligibility: Transfer students with at least a 3.0 GPA and 48 transferrable community college credit hours and named a New Century Scholar

Eagle Scout/Gold Award

- Award Amount: \$3,000 (\$1,500 per year for two years)
- Eligibility: Community college students who have achieved the levels of Eagle Scout or Gold Award

Dr. M. Lynne Murchison Scholarship

- Award Amount: Up to \$1,000 per year for one academic year
- Eligibility: Community College Transfer Students with a minimum GPA of 3.0. Must be enrolled full time at one or more UM Regional Campus.

Some families may need to consider grants, student and/or parent loans, or student employment to help meet the cost of attending the university. COMPLETE THE TRANSFER SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION BY MARCH 1:

UM Regional Campus Scholarships**

- Award Amount: \$1,000 per semester with a 3.5 to 4.0 GPA
\$400 per semester with a 2.5 to 3.499 GPA
Rates of scholarship are for four consecutive semesters (fall/spring)
- Eligibility: Transferring to a regional campus; applicants must have at least a 2.5 GPA, based on the University's method of calculating the transfer GPA, on a minimum of 48 hours from a community college. Must be enrolled full time at one or more UM Regional Campus.
- Priority deadlines: June 30 for fall admission, January 1 for spring admission

Luckyday University Scholarship

- Award Amount: \$10,000 (up to \$5,000 per year)
- Eligibility: Awarded to a select group of 25 community college transfer students with a 2.5 or higher overall GPA on at least 48 transferrable community college credit hours. Students receiving this award must be Mississippi residents and must be transferring from a Mississippi community college. In addition, students selected must have remaining financial need as determined by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) after other scholarships and grants have been awarded. Must also complete FAFSA by March 1 and complete the online Luckyday University Scholarship application.

Lyceum Scholars Award

- Award Amount: Full resident tuition per year for two years (fall and spring semesters)
- Eligibility: Transfer students with at least a 3.0 GPA and 48 transferrable community college credit hours and an exemplary record of leadership and service. Selection is competitive.

Community College Leadership Scholarship

- Award Amount: \$6,000 (\$3,000 per year for two years)
- Eligibility: Transfer students with at least a 3.0 GPA and 48 transferrable community college credit hours and an exemplary record of leadership and service. Selection is competitive.

Mississippi Community College Advantage Scholarship

- Award Amount: \$8,000 (\$4,000 per year for two years)
- Eligibility: Community college transfer students who are Mississippi residents with at least 48 transferrable community college credit hours and a 2.5 or higher overall transfer GPA. Students must be eligible for a federal Pell Grant and have a family adjusted gross income of \$30,000 or less (as reported on the previous year's federal tax return). This is a competitive scholarship, and 25 awards are offered each year. Must also complete FAFSA by March 1.

Students may generally stack scholarships up to their cost of attendance unless the award is paying a specific fee or restricted by financial need.

APPLY ONLINE AT FINAID.OLEMISS.EDU/TRANSFER-STUDENTS:

Federal Pell Grant

- Award Amount: Up to \$6,195; Award amounts are prorated based on the number of hours enrolled.
- Eligibility: Determined by the federal processor based on a formula approved by Congress using information supplied on the FAFSA. May receive up to the lifetime limit, equivalent to 6 full-time years in college (600%). Must not have previously earned a bachelor's degree.

Summers Grant

- Award Amount: Up to \$5,000 per year (\$2,500 per semester)
- Eligibility: Must be a resident of Attala, Carroll, Choctaw, Montgomery or Webster counties in Mississippi and enrolled in a degree program. Part-time students are eligible. Student does not have to be transferring from a community college.

Osher Reentry Scholarship

- Award Amount: Up to \$2,500 per year (\$1,250 per semester)
- Eligibility: Students who are pursuing their first baccalaureate degree; have experienced a cumulative gap in their education of five or more years since high school graduation or attainment of GED; are enrolled at least half time, are U.S. citizens between 25 and 50 years old, and have demonstrated financial need as determined by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). July 1 application deadline.

Robert E. Oesterling Regional Campus Out-of-State Scholarships

- Award Amount: Cost of out-of-state fee
- Eligibility: Out-of-state transfer students who have been admitted to an Ole Miss undergraduate degree-seeking program on a regional campus receive an out-of-state scholarship that is applied only to courses taken at a regional campus.

Mississippi Tuition Assistance Grant (MTAG)

- Award Amount: Up to \$1,000 per year (\$500 per semester); prorated for those who receive a Pell Grant; students who receive the maximum Pell award will not be MTAG eligible.
- Eligibility: One-year Mississippi residency, full-time enrollment, and 2.5 cumulative GPA required. Fifteen earned hours must be completed each semester. Applications are available at: msfinancialaid.org. All requirements must be completed by September 15 of each year.

UM Regional First Generation Scholarship

- Award Amount: \$1,000 per year (\$500 per semester for one academic year)
- Eligibility: First-generation undergraduate transfer students who have been admitted to one of the UM regional campuses. Must be pursuing their first four-year degree through one of the UM regional campuses. Must maintain full time enrollment, as well as a 2.0 GPA, and fulfill contract requirements in order to receive the scholarship. Recipients are required to complete EDHE 305 their first term at UM. Applicants must complete the UM First Generation Scholarship application, submit a 300-word essay, file the FAFSA, and maintain involvement in the First Generation Program.
