## Students will:

- Learn the roles and missions of various agencies involved in the management of federal public lands including the National Park Service, US Forest Service, Bureau of Land Management, and the US Fish and Wildlife Service.
- Gain a better understanding of the land management practices employed by these varying agencies.
- Visit a variety of public lands including the San Juan National Forest, Canyons of the Ancients National Monument, and Mesa Verde National Park.
- Experience the public lands of the area through a variety of activities including camping, hiking, river exploration, and fieldwork and lectures with the land managers.

- Develop educational storytelling materials, incorporating knowledge from the coursework and experiences from the fieldwork.
- Camp for the majority of the class in a campsite in lands covered by the San Juan Mountain Association.

## Location:

Students spend time in northern New Mexico and southern Colorado, primarily based out of public lands in the San Juan Mountains area, near Durango, CO.

# Who should go?

This course will see Education students partner with Public Policy Leadership students for a majority of the course work. Students in Education programs or PPL majors interested in this collaboration should apply.

**Prerequisite for EDCI, EDSE, and EDUC** is completion of EDCI 353 or the ability to hold a teaching license.

**Prerequisite for PPL 492** is identification as a Public Policy Leadership major.

### Dates:

Online and in person coursework June 28-July 18, 2018. On location July 19-28, 2018 in New Mexico and Colorado.

#### Travel:

Students will meet the instructors in Oxford, and travel together by van to the field sites in New Mexico and Colorado.

## Costs:

Program cost is \$1,245 plus tuition. Included in the cost are camping equipment rental, campsite fees, hotel costs during travel days, group ground transportation, and most meals. Excluded from the cost are the Study USA application fee, tuition, some meals, and personal spending money.
