Location:

Students will depart for New York City on Sunday, May 14 and will spend six nights in New York City, returning on Saturday, May 20. The following week will be spent on the Oxford campus. Shared hotel accommodations will be provided at The Pod 39.

Who should go?

This program is for Journalism or IMC majors who are classified as a junior or above. Good writing and editing skills are preferred and knowledge of InDesign is a plus. Preference will be given to students who have completed JOUR 401 or IMC 602.

Dates:

The program dates are May 14-26, 2017. Students will spend May 14-20 in New York City, followed by classroom instruction on the Oxford campus from May 22-26.

Travel:
